# Happy New Year - Message from Starosta

In my 2015 New Year wish I wrote about volunteering work connected with the expression "za dobrotu na zobrotu." In 2016 I put together a quiz to help us learn and remember the names of Sokol members who affected the history of ASW. Last year I chose to write about similarities between our community and chicken's 'pecking'. When I was thinking about what to make this year's topic, "What Sokol means to me" came to mind. I wrote an essay with same topic about 22 years ago (in 1995), at the end of a two-week training program to become a certified Sokol instructor. The instructor training camp took place under the Sokol USA umbrella in Berwin, NY. I learned valuable gymnastics instructor skills which I could then apply during our weekly Friday gym classes. Everybody who attended the camp had to write an essay "What Sokol means to me." I don't remember what I wrote; however, I do remember that I was proud of it. This was mainly because in about two months after the camp ended, I found that my essay was published in the National Sokol monthly newsletter. My essay could be read by all readers of National Sokol monthly newsletter within the USA. Well... about three months later; when browsing the newsletter (which is delivered to my home address every month); I realized they published almost everybody's essay....but I told myself that at least mine was published first!

So, that story aside, here is what Sokol means to me today: Sokol means community, sacrifices, willingness to help each other, love, and understanding. What more? What other nice words could we use? There is a plethora of words that could accurately be connected to Sokol. However, if you don't put meaning behind them, then they merely become insignificant dancing words.

Sokol means community; it is what glues our tiny Czech and Slovak community together here in the DC area. We share similar values, we speak the same languages, we like to gather and enjoy company of each other, and we want to pass that community value on to our children. We want to do that naturally without forcing our kids to attend the weekly Friday Sokol activities. We want them to discover the beauty of our Czech-Slovak culture, to find out how we differ from other cultures and why our culture is the one that we love and we value. This is our long-term goal; we know that it can't happen within one Sokol Friday night. One Czech-Slovak language class or a single Czech-Slovak folk dance rehearsal won't do it. But eventually it happens, and that is what keeps our community thriving.

Sokol means sacrifices; our organization wouldn't exist without our Sokol member sacrifices. We offer our free time, our skills and our talents to our Sokol organization for free. We do that often without thinking that we do something special. From time to time a thought comes to our mind "ok this would be my last year and then somebody else should pick up and do what I have done". I hope that this not your case, I hope that you continue your valuable work for our organization for many, many more years. Nevertheless, we appreciate all and any sacrifice that our members have made for us.

Sokol means willingness to help each other. It's not easy for me to write about this meaning since I can see that this is not always, what we do. Most of the time we are helping each other; however, there are moments when I am not so convinced that we all are trying to do so. Perhaps it's because we are just humans and sometimes we fail to understand each other or we simply don't want to try to understand each other.

Expression: 'kto do teba kamenom ty donho chlebom' came to my mind. If someone throws a stone at you, you throw bread back at them. You might think I am either crazy or naive or expecting too much. I believe though that this is how families survive. Go into your memories: how many times has your own

understand why mom was not throwing a stone back at you. Maybe if this extreme situation happens and we don't know how it could be overcome, perhaps applying this expression might work.
