Dear Chief



Following are reflections about the 2018 Všesokolský slet from Mia Mendel, age 14, who has been a member of TJ Sokol Hanspaulka (in Prague) since the age of two. For her entire life Mia has lived part-time in the Czech Republic, and part time in Baltimore, Maryland.

"I have always loved how I can come back after spending 8 months in Maryland and feel like no time has passed," she says. "Until now I didn't imagine that the feeling of family could extend beyond our local Sokol group. But wow was I wrong. On the first day of mass rehearsals, I was overwhelmed with the atmosphere of friendship and community. Everyone greeted me with a friendly 'Nazdar!' or 'Ahoy!', rather than a formal "dobry den." Many of us were getting annoyed sometimes that we had to stand outside in the burning hot sun for hours. But at least we were annoyed together, finding a common enemy — in this case, the weather."




