Dear Sokol members and dear friends of Sokol Washington,

WINTER CAMP IN BURKE VERMONT



The Sokol headed up to Burke Mountain in Vermont over the holidays for our annual Sokol ski trip. There was great food, great entertainment, great accommodation, great friends and of course, great skiing.

From a kid's point of view:

A Day at Winter Camp By Dominik Honzak

It's morning at Burke Mountain, cloudy, cold, and snowing a mix of ice and snow-- which is pretty normal for a day of Sokol winter camp here in Vermont. I have been invited to write this article instead of skiing today because yesterday I sprained my ankle while skiing on this wet icy stuff. A typical day...We get up at 7:30 to 8:00 am, put on our ski gear and eat breakfast quickly, so that we can get outside to morning warm-up on time. After the warm-up, our ski passes are distributed to us, and we then join the other kids in our respective groups (we are each assigned to a ski group for the week, organized by skill level and age). Then, we put on our ski boots or snowboard shoes and walk up the steep hill with our skis or snowboards to the lift that goes to the top of the mountain. These are some of the boring/hard parts to every morning. As you go up the ski lift the weather and temperature drastically change. We ski rain or shine. On some mornings the lift that goes up to the top of the mountain (there is another one at the bottom) is closed because of weird things, such as that it's -50 degrees at the top of all the slopes are not groomed yet. The instructors teach us proper techniques -- how to carve, and various other things. As you get better, you are placed into more advanced groups. To see how much you have progressed each year, we have a race at the end of each camp. In the evenings we eat dinner together in one cabin, and afterward, the kids (including teens like me) go to the games which are different each day. Everyone is in a group and we compete in the games. The winners at the end of the camp get a prize, like lots of candy. At the end of each day, we all go to bed exhausted from a long day. At the end of the camp each year, we are sad that it is over, but we look forward to the next year!



The kids of our Czech and Slovak School went into the Christmas break with a bang as we held our annual School Christmas Party. UNVEILING THE BUST OF GENERAL STEFANIK

On November 21, 2019 Ambassador of the Slovak Republic to the United States Ivan Korcok unveiled the bust of General Milan Rastislav Štefánik at the event organized in the National Czech and Slovak Library in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. The bust was created by Slovak sculptor Klára Sever, who lives in Falls Church, Va.

Milan Rastislav Štefánik (21 July 1880 – 4 May 1919) was a Slovak politician, diplomat, aviator, and astronomer. During World War I, he served as a general of the French Army and later as the first Minister of War of Czechoslovakia. As one of the leading members of the Czechoslovak National Council (the resistance government), he contributed decisively to the cause of Czechoslovak sovereignty. He is considered to be one of the founders of Czechoslovakia.
