MEETING PLACE: Starbucks close to Front Royal, Exit 6 from Rt 66;

125 Riverton Commons Plaza, Front Royal, VA 22630

(Please use the address for directions since there is another Starbucks at Target nearby)

WHEN: SATURDAY, MAY 22 AT 9:15 AM

We will continue together by car (20min) to trailhead: parking at the end of VA630 where the paved road ends. DO NOT park on the gravel private driveway. Please respect private property. N 38.80194, W 78.31461

The hike is 8.5 miles long. From the trailhead, we go counterclockwise uphill to see the waterfall and have snacks. At this point, you have most of the climbing behind you, and you decide if you want to turn back and make it shorter or finish the whole loop. We can reunite at the swimming hole - the favorite highlight of this hike. From that place, it is a very short hike to the parking lot.

Tired but refreshed, you can join us for family camping, and if you wish to continue having fun, join us for a <u>canoe trip</u> the next day.

family's financial burden.

As you may know, David collapsed on April 17th and was rushed to the ER. They diagnosed him with a ruptured aneurysm in his brain. He had to be airlifted to a hospital in Washington, DC, that has a neurosurgeon on staff. It has been a rollercoaster ride since then; as soon as he seems to be improving, other complications arise. At this time, he is also fighting pneumonia.

Unfortunately, health insurance will not cover certain expenses. Average recovery from a brain injury may take up to 6 months. Their deductible and out-of-pocket

maximum combined is almost 30K. Airfare for his parents, who hope to be granted special permission to travel here from the Czech Republic is needed. In addition, there are living expenses (monthly mortgage, health insurance, car payments, other bills), and most probably the helicopter ride (25-40K). With this in mind, we are setting an initial goal of \$100K to help ease the



stay-at-home mom, is not able to visit him in the hospital due to Covid-19 restrictions. The inability of the family to visit in person is devastating. Their girls are missing daddy tremendously.

The family is overwhelmed by the outpouring of love and support received. By contributing to this fund, you are helping to alleviate the second most stressful worry that the Vlcek family is facing, the first being David's health and ultimate recovery.

Let's simplify citizenship for Slovaks abroad

Below is a compatriot initiative, <u>One Slovak Family</u>, regarding the proposed amendment of the Slovak Citizenship Act.

The Slovak Parliament is currently debating an amendment to the Citizenship Act, which would allow children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of Czechoslovak citizens born in Slovakia to apply for citizenship of the Slovak Republic.



It would be a simplified form of naturalization, which would require neither knowledge of the language, nor a certain amount of years' residence.

However, as it is proposed, it would require the applicant to have a residence permit in Slovakia.

We would therefore like to ask for your support, as a compatriot organization, for our <u>petition to waive this residence</u> <u>requirement, so that fellow descendants of Slovaks abroad may apply for citizenship via an embassy.</u>











April 30th is St. Jacob's Night (Svatojakubská noc). It is a special day in the Czech Republic and is a celebration of the "burning of witches" (*pálení čarodějnic*). This custom marks a farewell to winter and welcomes spring.

In the Czech Republic, people believed that the power of witches would weaken as the weather got warmer. So, they gathered and set up a bonfire where they burned an effigy of the witch that kept winter too long. We remembered this tradition in the Czech school where children created these beautiful witches in art classes. On St. Jacob's Friday night, we made a fire and burned the imaginary witches we made. At the same time, the children roasted sausages, told us scary stories, and sang Czech songs.
