# **Bike Nonstop US - Bike Race**

On June 17th, 2022, our organization received an email from *Aleš Zavoral* informing us about his intention to participate in the bike race Bike Nonstop US and seeking help after he would arrive at the finish point, which was Washington, D.C. The starting point of the race was in Portland, Oregon. The length of the race was 3,528 miles (approx. 5,700 km). He was starting on June 19th, expecting an arrival between July 7th and July 14th, with 12 participants. We replied to Aleš's email and offered to help him upon arrival in Washington, D.C.

Aleš's performance in the **Bike Nonstop US** race was impressive. He crossed the finish line in first place in 18 days and 11 hours on July 7th, 2022. Each day he biked about 200 miles (320 km) with an average speed of 12 mph (20 km/h). The second racer crossed the finish line in Washington, D.C. 4 days later, the third one seven days after.

One of our board members offered Aleš accommodation in her house after he finished the race. He shared about his adventures from the bike race with several of our members and friends in the evening before he left back home to the Czech Republic (Aleš is in the picture in the middle holding the Czech flag).

We congratulate Aleš Zavoral for his excellent triumph during to Bike Nonstop US race, and we wish him all the best in his other bike races.

# Jiří Trtík and his Concert for Forest

**Jiří Trtík** is a young Czech composer, conductor, and educator. He created and was involved in many interesting musical projects in the Czech Republic, the USA, and many other places. In his classical music compositions, he is, among other things, strongly inspired by nature and goes beyond by exploring the mutual relations between nature and mankind and the consequences human activity may have on nature. However, he does not want to be called an environmentalist as he feels that any movement that goes to the extreme may become propaganda and be harmful in the end.



Jiří earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in composition from the

Cleveland Institute of Music, where he lived and studied for four years. He considers his study stay in the USA a significant experience in many aspects. He describes it as highly professional, encouraging students to get deeply immersed in their studies and work hard. In addition, his stay in another part of the world has expanded his views in general. Currently, he lives in the Czech Republic, composes for various international orchestras and ensembles, and teaches at The Department of General Theory at the International Prague Conservatory. He was successful in several music competitions. He won the WCSMS 2018 Promising Young Composers Competition. He received 2nd price and Special



Prize for The Best Czech Composition at the International Composition Competition Generace 2019 at the Janáček International Music Festival in Ostrava.

His family comes from Číhošť, and thus Jiri has been strongly influenced by the fate of Father Josef Toufar. He was tortured to death by the communists in 1950. It inspired Jiri to put one of Toufar's prayers to music in 2015, and the composition is called My Jesus (Můj Ježíši).

Nature is an excellent source of motivation for Jiri. After visiting Yellowstone, he wrote

the composition Echos of Yellowstone (Ozvěny Yellowstonu).

Concert for Forest was one of his most significant recent projects to reestablish our connection to nature. Jiří was the author of the music, and established ensemble STRO.MY to this end, and raised money for it by crowdfunding. This

unusual concert took place this July in an untraditional environment of a cut-down forest in Mnisek pod Brdy. The musicians played in the woods, and the chorus represented the dead trees walking inside the forest while singing. Jiří says that this was a unique and very moving experience for him.

# Tomato and Pepper Stew - Lečo [lecho]

# A perfect summer meal

The season of fresh vegetables is peaking. This tomato and peppers stew (Lečo) dish uses the freshest summer ingredients like ripe tomatoes, green and/or banana peppers, and optional zucchinis. The preparation is simple, and the result is tasty, seasonal, and above all, full of vitamins.

(You can prepare this dish using fresh or canned vegetables, whichever you have on hand throughout the winter.)

NOTE: Onions should be sliced, not finely chopped. All vegetables peeled.

Roast the peppers, peel, and slice. Scald the tomatoes with boiling water, peel, and slice.

This method is tedious - you can use raw vegetables without peeling.

### Ingredients

- 1 onion
- 2-3 cloves of garlic
- 3 tomatoes
- 4 peppers
- summer zucchini (optional)
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup tomato sauce
- salt
- ground pepper
- sweet red paprika (smoked red paprika optional)
- sausage (optional)

# Directions

In a dutch oven or other heavy pot, heat one tablespoon of oil;



Add sliced onions and cook for 3 minutes;

Add two chopped pieces of garlic and one tablespoon of fresh thyme and cook for another minute;

Add one tablespoon of tomato paste and 1 cup of sausage (if using one) and cook for 5 minutes;

Add cubed tomatoes and zucchini (optional);

Add 1 cup of tomato sauce, one teaspoon of sweet and smoked paprika (you can add 1/4 teaspoon of hot Hungarian paprika for a spicier version);

Add eggs and mix;

Season with salt and pepper, cover, and let it simmer for 20 minutes; Serve with fresh bread or rice.
