



Ester Wiesnerova Concert at the Slovak Embassy

Commemorating the 30th anniversary of Slovak independence

The Slovak Embassy in Washington, DC, presented a delightful concert with gentle, enchanting jazz tunes that Ester Wiesnerova and her international quartet invited us to relish. Ester transforms the ordinary into beauty and invites us to listen more intensely to the transforming power of art.

Ester Wiesnerova is Slovakia's internationally active vocalist, composer, and educator. She was discovered on a television singing competition, "The Voice of Czechoslovakia," before starting her professional musical endeavors. Recently, Ester was named in Forbes' 30 under 30 list and awarded the Gunther Schuller Medal.

Her critically acclaimed debut album Blue Journal was released in May 2022. The music is recorded by a unique international quintet featuring a jazz harp and percussion.







DID YOU KNOW

CZECHS SPEND MORE TIME READING THAN ANY OTHER EUROPEAN NATION

A newly released study says people in the Czech Republic read more than anywhere else in Europe as well a number of other nations in the world

"As far as heavy reading is concerned, Czechs are above the average. As far as passionate reading, more than fifty books read per year, the Czech Republic is again at the very top."

The Czech Republic has always had a strong reading culture. Czechs are known for having extensive home libraries; to this day, a book is considered one of the most popular birthday and Christmas gifts.

During the Communist era, books by forbidden authors were secretly passed down from hand to hand.

A recent survey has shown that the Czech Republic has the densest network of public libraries in the EU, with almost as many libraries as towns. Does that mean that Czechs still belong among the most avid readers in Europe?



THE XVII ALL-SOKOL SLET GATHERING IS UNDERWAY! JUNE 30 – JULY 5, 2024 PRAGUE, CZECHIA



The 17th All-Sokol Slet gathering is set to take place in Prague from June 30 to July 5, 2024, the organizers announced. Around 20,000 people are expected to attend the event, which will have an accompanying program at the National Theatre and other venues.

Preparations for one of the largest sports and social celebrations, (SLET) "The 17th All-Sokol Slet gathering", are underway for everyone worldwide. Such gatherings are held every six years by Sokol, a gymnastics and fitness association that dates back to the 19th century Czech National Revival.

The rally team expects the participation of 20 thousand trainees and over 40 thousand spectators from all corners of the Czech Republic and abroad.


An estimated number of 100,000 Sokols will participate in the event. Over 1000 gym units will be involved in the event. Sokol operates in 18 countries of the world. It was the foreign units that kept the tradition of gatherings at the times when the Sokol activities were banned.

As part of the Environmental Film Festival in the Nation's Capital, the Embassy of the Czech Republic will screen Wilder than Wilderness (Planeta Česko) on March 21 at 6 pm. Join us as we uncover the resiliency of plants and animals in the Czech Republic.

WILDER THAN WILDERNESS (Planeta Česko)

Directed by: Marián Polák, 2017, 83 minutes

The wildlife film essay focuses on Czech nature's resilient power and variety. Within the environment of open-cast brown coal mines and spoil tips reminiscent of a lunar landscape, one paradoxically finds an accurate tale of an impregnable wild countryside. For most people, it symbolizes an ecological catastrophe, like the abandoned industrial complexes and former army training ranges. But for nature, they are untamed spots that bring a process of recovery and self-preservation. Just beyond our backyard,



we see everyday dramas of animals and plants taking place, which fascinate us in films from the far reaches of our planet.

TRADITIONAL RECIPES



Česnečka – Garlic soup

Czech Garlic Soup, aka Česnečka, is regarded as a cure for all ailments, including the common cold and, of course, hangovers.

Anti-inflammatory garlic makes for a warming and healthful traditional soup. It boasts garlic, potatoes, and crunchy rye bread croutons!

Ingredients

½ tablespoon unsalted butter

6 to 8 cloves garlic, crushed (even more if you'd like!)

6 cups chicken, beef, or vegetable broth or stock

Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

- 1 pound potatoes (white, yellow, or red-not russets), peeled and diced
- 1 teaspoon dried marjoram
- 1 teaspoon caraway seeds
- 1 large egg, beaten (optional)
- 3 ounces (3 to 4 slices) rye bread, cubed
- 1 teaspoon olive oil or olive oil spray
- 4 ounces cubed cheese, Emmental, Gruyere, or Camembert–rind removed (optional)
 - 2 tablespoons finely chopped parsley



Instructions

- 1. Melt the butter in a medium pan over medium heat, and add the garlic. Cook until softened and aromatic, about 4 to 5 minutes (lower the heat if it gets brown). Add the broth and bring it to a boil over high heat.
- 2. While boiling, season with salt and pepper, then add the diced potatoes, marjoram, and caraway seeds. Reduce heat and simmer, covered for 15 to 20 minutes until the potatoes are tender. Adjust seasoning as needed.
- 3. If you add an egg, pour it in slowly while mixing the soup to create ribbons of cooked egg (similar to Chinese egg drop soup).
- 4. Meanwhile, heat an oven or toaster oven to 350°F. Add the cubed rye bread to a small sheet pan and either drizzle with olive oil or spray with olive oil spray, and toss with your hands to coat. Toast for 10 to 15 minutes, occasionally stirring, until golden brown and crispy. Set aside until the soup is done.
- 5. Serve the soup topped with croutons and parsley, and stir in cheese if desired (or put the cheese in the bowl first and then pour the soup on top). Serve immediately.
