It is with sad hearts that we share this news about our friend Daniel.





DANIEL ANÝŽ, a prominent Czech journalist who died after a short and serious illness in Prague on September 30, 2023, at the age of 59, was not only an outstanding expert on American politics, but also an active and popular member of Sokol Washington. From 2006 to 2010, he was the US correspondent for Hospodářské noviny. With his and Vilma's children Marjánka and Dominik, he went regularly and keenly to Friday Sokol exercises in Bethesda, participated in canoe trips to Modrá Skála, skied with us in Vermont, or took part in the Libor Kozák Cycling Memorials. During his years in Washington, he also met and became friends with Jana Kánská. Later he published a great book about her mother, Milada Horáková, and the life story of their entire family, Jdu s hlavou vztyčenou (2020).

Daniel graduated in geology and only started working in journalism in the free Czechoslovakia in the 1990s. He worked for almost all the important Czech newspapers and media - in the last years for aktuálně.cz. His main specialization and passion was American politics and society. No Czech journalist knew it like Daniel. He reported from the USA not only on the presidential elections but on many other topics. His regular trips to undecided voters in swing districts in Ohio or Pennsylvania were legendary. Daniel was not only a great analyst - really the best in Czechia of all those covering American politics - but also an old-school reporter. He didn't work from a desk, he was in the field, interviewing people, always interested about their opinions and lives.

Dan was an avid and accomplished cyclist. His almost daily bike trips, wherever he was, were his life's passion. Just a few weeks before his unexpected and sudden death, many of us, former and current members of Sokol Washington, spent a lovely weekend with Daniel at the summer house in Cvikov. Dan, of course, biked the 100 kilometers from his home to get there. Unfortunately, it was the last time Koloušek - Daniel's old Boy Scouts nickname - would be together with many of his Sokol Washington friends.



November will be full of exciting activities as well!





November 2, 2023 | 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.




The Embassy of the Slovakia cordially invites you to "This is My World" Poetry and



The Avalon Theatre will screen the award-winning film Shadow Country (Krajina ve stínu) by director Bohdan Sláma on November 8, 2023, at 8 p.m., as part of the ongoing Lions of Czech Film Series. The film won six Czech Lions in 2020, including Best Actress, Best Supporting Actress, and Best Screenplay.



SHADOW COUNTRY (Krajina ve stínu) is a striking and unique account of life in a Czech border town before, during, and just after World War II. As the rise of Nazism threatens the small town of Schwarzwald bordering Austria, the Austrian and Czechoslovakian villagers must choose their political allegiances, some of which have dire consequences. At the same time, Karel Veber signs himself and most of his family as German; his wife Marie sticks to her Czech heritage and refuses to sign. When Josef Pachl is arrested for his resistance activity, he returns to the village post-war with a score to settle. This divided small town serves as an allegory for the nation at large and demonstrates how violence is never the answer in this unforgettable, timely, multiple-award-winning war drama.

ŠUNKOFLEKY - HAM EGG AND NOODLE CASSEROLE

It's time for an egg custard meal you remember from childhood! **Šunkofleky, Czech Ham and Noodle Bake** comfort food, a pasta blend with smoked meat and plenty of eggs. It is a dish where Czech grandmothers processed leftovers from the kitchen. They pan-fried the ham, the leftover meat, and onions. Then they mixed it with cooked noodles, put it in a baking dish, poured over milk beaten with eggs, and baked šunkofleky in the oven.



INGREDIENTS

1 lb (450 g) pasta - wide noodles
9 oz (250 g) bacon in one piece, half fat, half lean
Eight whole eggs
½ stick (55 g) butter unsalted, more to use in the baking
dish
salt
pepper
parsley for garnish
pickles



INSTRUCTIONS

Grease a 9x12" cast iron casserole dish thoroughly with butter. Heat the oven to 350 °F (180 °C). Cook the pasta in salt water al dente, following the manufacturer's instructions.

Meanwhile, dice the bacon into about 1/2-inch pieces and fry them in a pan with butter. Crack the eggs into a separate bowl, beat them gently with a fork, and add salt. Strain the pasta, put it into a larger bowl, and mix in butter until it completely dissolves. Mix the hot pasta with fried bacon, salt and pepper, and eggs. Layer the pasta blend into the greased dish and bake for 30 minutes until the top turns gold.

Let them cool down, cut into squares, and place on a plate. Garnish with green parsley. Serve with pickles.

½ teaspoon salt ½ teaspoon sugar 1¼ teaspoon instant yeast 1 cup lukewarm milk (250 ml) Oil for frying
